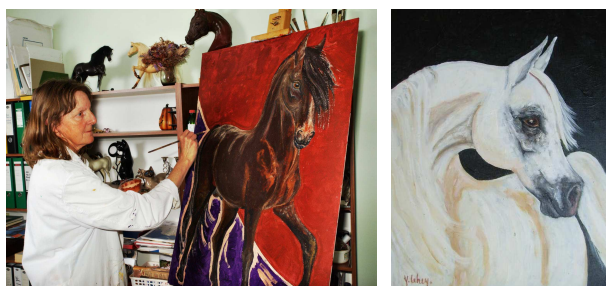


My specialty is working with people with confidence issues and helping them to become happy and relaxed riders.

Apart from general horsemanship in harmony with classical dressage, my areas of speciality include clicker training and gaited horses. Clinics can be held at our facility in Dereel or at a venue of your choice anywhere in Australia or overseas.
